
MY VIEW ON DOUBLE VACCINATION PROOF.


just tell them you are on the naughty list and they do the rest because they already have your details. A similar system could work.


IHC vehicles seen on travels here, there and somewhere else


















25 years ago . . in T&BT.

December 1944

The great shortage of trucks and other transport vehicles in Australia is likely to be lifted to a marked degree as surplus vehicles through Army parks reticulate back to the public, states the Commonwealth Disposals Commission, in an official announcement for 'Truck & Bus Transportation'. It was announced by the Disposals Commission that 2000 surplus trucks and light utilities will be immediately released, and that it hoped that shortly there would be a steady flow through these parks as vehicles were declared surplus by the Army. The range is from one ton to five tons, including 30 cwt. There is also a number of special types designed for War Departments. In this section the Commission is selling the short wheelbase vehicles to fire-fighting organisations.


The Victorian Transport Co-ordination Bill, which proposed to reduce Country representation on the Transport Board, and to create a Transport Co-ordination Committee on which there would be representatives of State controlled transport systems, whose interests were fundamentally opposed to the progress of motor road transport, has been postponed until the 1945 Autumn Session of Parliament. Victorian Road Passenger Service Operators' Committee strenuously opposed this measure, as it was feared that if it became law, road transport services would be subjected to disabilities more serious than those being experienced at the hands of the present Transport Regulation Board.


Ansett Airways Ltd. and its subsidiaries, Ansett Roadways, have purchased all of the shares in Pioneer Tourist Coaches Pty. Ltd. and Pioneer will be run in future as a subsidiary of Ansett. Purchase price, based on the dormant situation of Pioneer at present, represented payment for the rights, licences and goodwill of Pioneer Tourist Coaches. It was intended to resume operations when permits and equipment were forthcoming. Pioneer has operated tourist services in South Australia, Victoria, New South Wales, Queensland and the Northern Territory for 30 years.

In Victoria, users of essential motor vehicles in country areas will be issued with a special ration of petrol in the summer so that they will not need to use their gas-producer units. This action is intended to obviate the danger of bush fires caused by sparks and coals from producer units. On days when bush fire warnings were issued motor vehicle users in the country could switch over to petrol. Owners of other vehicles operating in the country on producer gas should ensure that they had sufficient petrol tickets to enable them to switch over, otherwise they must not operate.
