
The next stage with the floor base will be done by Richardson's grader and roller—so thanks in advance.

There is a lot more work to be done over the coming months.


Contributions from TRACS members will mean we will get a good setup for a lot less money than using contractors.

Real history in pencil on the back of a door.


After being delayed by wet weather twice and once by a heatwave, Bob's trek finally happened.

A good trek enjoyed by all.







Port Pirie, 'Stories of the Road Museum' - 30 March - 2 April 2023
