Preparations for the annual tractor pull and truck show got under way at Wilga Road, Red Cliffs, in northern Victoria, on Friday,7 October, after a beak due to the Covid problem.

There were many members doing the required jobs to ensure a successful day; some were erecting the 'tucker tent', the 'office' ie. the record keeping area, others were lining up the exhibits in the delegated areas, eg. tractors not participating in the pull, and trucks in lines in different areas

All of this was being 'overseen' by the close proximity of the famous (in this area) **Big Lizzie's** second trailer.

The 'Michael O'Callagan Pavilion' held the blackboard for recording the results of each effort, plus a bench holding entry forms and on another wall was a display of older truck and tractor photographs.



In the background, some distance from all the activity, stood the two sleds—the big and the small, in their new white livery after maintenance and painting by enthusiastic members.

From then there was a procession of tractors 'doing their thing', or in other attempts 'trying to do their thing' with not much success.


The day was most a most successful, and the sun shine was appreciated by all.


On Sunday we did a trek around Wedderburn in the morning and back for dinner time. Then packing up to go home.
